## You May Review and Comment on Proposed Continued Groundwater Treatment at the Former Kearney-KPF Facility, 1624 E. Alpine Ave. in Stockton

### Public Comment from March 1, 2017 to April 14, 2017

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) invites your comment on the draft Post-Closure Permit proposed for the former Kearney-KPF Inc. facility. If approved, Kearney-National Inc. (Kearney) will continue groundwater treatment at the former facility, 1624 E Alpine Avenue, Stockton CA 95205.

A short summary follows:

- **Kearney remotely operates five wells to pull out** contaminated groundwater.
- **They treat the groundwater with an ultraviolet light** oxidation system and an air stripper to remove 1, 4-dioxane and other solvents from the water.
- **Kearney discharges the now treated water to a basin** which allows the water to soak back into the ground.

DTSC will hold a public hearing to discuss this proposal.
