Please join the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) at two public meetings for the Community Protection and Hazardous Waste Reduction (Haz-Waste Reduction) Initiative. The [Haz-Waste Reduction Initiative](#) is designed to leverage DTSC's stated goal of reducing hazardous waste generated in California and disposed in hazardous waste landfills by 2025.
