DTSC Holds “Scoping Meetings” on Exide Residential Cleanup EIR

For consideration in public announcement/community calendars

SACRAMENTO – The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) is testing for lead in the soil of residential properties near the former Exide Technologies facility in Vernon. Properties with the highest levels of lead and the greatest risk for exposure will be cleaned up.

Governor Brown signed legislation directing \$176.6 million for this sampling and cleanup program. DTSC is holding two public meetings for residents to comment on how the cleanup work could affect their neighborhoods. This feedback will help shape the scope of the Environmental Impact Report.
