Cal/EPA Announces Winners at Household Hazardous Waste Conference

SACRAMENTO --- Citing the need to continue the reduction of hazardous waste from California households, Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) Director Ed Lowry commended a dozen California counties for their excellence, ingenuity and achievement at the 2002 California Environmental Protection Agency (Cal/EPA) Household Hazardous Waste Conference in Ventura. The awards are a featured part of the Seventh Annual Household Hazardous Waste Conference sponsored by DTSC and the Integrated Waste Management Board.

The awards include Outstanding Personal Service, Best New Program, Program Excellence, Outstanding Rural Program, and Program Innovation. The Awards Committee selected thirteen winners.

DTSC provides assistance to city and county governments seeking to establish household hazardous waste programs, and regulates the disposal of used oil and household hazardous wastes. The Integrated Waste Management Board provides financial assistance to local entities through several grant programs and through partnerships with local governments, industry and the public.

Cities and counties administer California's household hazardous waste programs. The programs feature household hazardous waste collection days that give residents a method of safe disposal of household items such as old paint, pesticides, used oil, and other household hazardous waste.
