

HOW TO OBTAIN CENSUS DATA

Information on the Census Bureau's Census Tract Resources is available at <http://www.census.gov/geo/www/tractez.html>. Census tract numbers and poverty data from the 1990 census can be found from a street address using the following resources:

1. Census maps and poverty tables may be reviewed at a State Data Center* or perhaps a local library. Maps may be purchased from the Census Bureau: (301) 763-4636. 3'x4' maps are \$5 per sheet (\$25.00 minimum order). Several maps make up a country.
2. Internet service from the Federal Institutions Examination Council (FFIEC). This will return a census tract number from an address, also median income levels. On the Internet: <http://www.ffiec.gov/geocode/default.htm>.
3. Poverty Lookup Tables for poverty rates in Tracts with 20% or more poor for California. This is available on the Internet at: <http://www.census.gov/housing/tracts/> and then click on "Californ.txt".
