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Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) Project Status Update for Former Wyle Laboratories Norco Facility Site July 14, 2009

DTSC releases a portion of Wyle property

DTSC approved Remedial Action Plan associated with eastern portion of Wyle property. The property is zoned M2, industrial. The property is split into four operable units: The Upper Basin, the Lower Basin, Northwest Area, and the Offsite Area. This RAP applies only to the Upper Basin operable unit. The 211-acre Upper Basin is located on the eastern portion of the property and includes historical operational areas including Area F5, Area J, Area K, and the Quarry.

DTSC required Wyle to conduct a comprehensive remedial investigation (RI) of the entire property, including the Upper Basin. Based on the review of the RI results, soil in small portions of Area J, including J11 and J14, were found to be impacted with polychlorinated biphenyls, perchlorate, and lead, respectively. As a result, DTSC required that a removal action work plan (RAW) be prepared and implemented to address impacted soil in these areas. The RAW was successfully implemented during the summer of 2008. DTSC approved the Removal Action Completion Report (RACR) which documented and summarized the field activities on January 22, 2009.

The draft RAP and the Notice of Exemption were made available for public review. A 30-day public comment period for both documents was held from April 16, 2009 through May 15, 2009, with a public meeting held on May 5, 2009. DTSC received comments from three parties during the public comment period and subsequently prepared "Responses to Comments." The comments were evaluated with respect to the need for modification(s) to the RAP. DTSC forwarded the enclosed response to public comments to parties who submitted comments and provided contact information. DTSC determined that modification(s) of the RAP is not necessary based on the comments received.

Based on the results of the RI and the RACR, DTSC concluded that no further action for the Upper Basin is appropriate and that the Upper Basin is suitable for unrestricted land use.
