



**PUBLIC NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING
and Public Comment Period
Draft Remedial Action Plan
Inactive Rancho Cordova Test Site**

DTSC has proposed a Draft Remedial Action Plan for the at the Inactive Rancho Cordova Test Site, formerly run by the McDonnell Douglas Corporation, southeast of the intersection of Sunrise Boulevard and White Rock Road in Rancho Cordova, California. The Draft Remedial Action Plan, if approved, will allow Aerojet General Corporation, the owner of the property, as well as Boeing Corporation, the successor corporation to McDonnell Douglas Corporation to:

- Add more groundwater extraction wells and additional pipeline within the former Main Base area and in the open space east and south of the runways at Mather Field. These pipes will transport contaminated groundwater to a treatment plant using activated carbon.
- Add more groundwater extraction wells located near the main pipelines along Douglas Road and the PG&E easement and about 500 feet of additional pipeline. These pipes will transport contaminated groundwater to a treatment plant using activated carbon.
- Continue to operate the existing SVE systems at the Alpha/IOC-1 Complex and at the former Administration Area.
- Construct groundwater pump and treat systems to clean up contamination at Sigma and PBA. These systems will have up to three groundwater extraction wells and two injection wells.
- Record a deed restriction on the use of groundwater and to protect public health.

To meet the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act, DTSC, in its role as the Lead Agency for the soil cleanup and a responsible agency for development of the site, has prepared an initial study that evaluates the potential for environmental impacts. DTSC has decided that these activities are unlikely to

produce any significant impact to the public or the environment and has proposed a Negative Declaration.
