FOURTH FIVE-YEAR REVIEW

MIDWAY VILLAGE

Daly City, California

The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) is conducting a Five-Year Review of the cleanup of contaminated soil at Midway Village Site, located at the intersection of Schwerin Street and Midway Drive in Daly City, California, 94014. The purpose of the Five-Year Review is to make sure that the environmental cleanup that was completed in 2003 is still effective, and that the remedy is functioning as designed and is maintained appropriately to protect human health and the environment.

The Midway Village Site is a residential development owned by the San Mateo County Housing Authority. It includes a daycare center also owned by the County of San Mateo, and is adjacent to the Bayshore Park Site owned by Daly City and the PG&E Martin Service Center. A manufactured gas plant operated from approximately 1905 to 1916 at the Martin Service Center Site and produced a waste material which contains polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs). Environmental sampling in 1990 indicated that soils at the Midway Village Site contained PAHs. In 1993 DTSC approved a remedial plan that required removing the contaminated soil in the upper two feet and capping the area with two feet of clean soil, concrete patios, asphalt walkways, or building foundations. The work was completed in 1994, and a deed restriction was recorded in 1998 to ensure proper maintenance of the cap. DTSC conducts an inspection as part of the Five-Year Review to ensure the contaminated soil remains under the cap.
