Draft Post Closure Permit for Land Treatment Area


The California Environmental Protection Agency Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) invites you to review and comment on the draft Hazardous Waste Post-Closure Facility Permit for the former Land Treatment Area (LTA) at the Phillips 66 Company, San Francisco Refinery, located at 1380 San Pablo Avenue, Rodeo, California, 94572.

Site Description and History

The Land Treatment Area (LTA) is located in an undeveloped area in the southern portion of the Facility property. The entire LTA occupies approximately 8.2 acres, of which 6.4 acres were used for land treatment of oily sludge and other oil refining wastes generated at the SFR between 1975 and 1983. The remaining acreage at the LTA consists of access roads and surface water run-on and runoff control berms and ditches.

Why is a Post-Closure Permit Needed?

This is the Post-Closure Permit Renewal for the LTA. The permit is required to make sure the LTA is safely maintained and groundwater wells are monitored to prevent releases of contamination. Each Permit lasts for 10 years. The San Francisco Regional Water Quality Control Board is overseeing the cleanup of soil and groundwater contamination at the Phillips 66 San Francisco Refinery.

What Happens During a Post-Closure Permit?

DTSC oversees the permit and conducts inspections. The LTA and the vegetation cover are checked and repaired if needed. Groundwater wells and soil samples are tested for chemicals. The wells are repaired and replaced as needed. The LTA is fenced and caution signs are posted according to law. Reports with all test results are provided to DTSC annually. DTSC reviews the reports to make sure contamination is not released, the wells are maintained, and there is no damage to the cover, fences and other protective features of the LTA.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

In compliance with CEQA, DTSC must evaluate if the Post-Closure Permit may have any significant effect on human health and the environment. In response, DTSC prepared a Notice of Exemption (NOE) which concludes that the re-issuance of the Post-Closure Permit will not have a significant negative effect on human health or the environment.

Next Steps

After the public comment period ends, DTSC will review and evaluate any comments received. After the public comments have been considered, DTSC will issue a Response to Comments (RTC) document. The RTC will be mailed to individuals who submitted a written comment that included an e-mail or postal mailing address. DTSC will then make a final decision on the Post-Closure Permit.

Enforcement History

DTSC has only found minor violations of the permit in the past five years. The minor violation was cited in November 2012 for a deficiency in the contingency plan which was corrected on December 2012 and in May 2016 for financial responsibility that was corrected in June 2016.
