

**NOTIFICATION OF PROPOSED EMERGENCY REGULATORY ACTION
(RE-ADOPTION)**

**Disposition Options for Universal Waste Cathode Ray Tubes (CRTs) and
CRT Glass**

**Department Reference Number: R-2011-03
Office of Administrative Law Emergency Number: 2012-1003-01E**

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) is proposing to re-adopt emergency regulations which expand the existing options for the disposition of CRTs and CRT glass currently regulated under universal waste regulations by removing the standard that a universal waste handler may treat CRTs only if the glass is sent for recycling to either a CRT glass manufacturer or a primary or secondary lead smelter. This regulatory action is the second readoption of these emergency regulations and follows the initial readoption of the emergency regulations (OAL File No. 2014-0905-03 EE). DTSC proposes to amend regulations in California Code of Regulations, title 22, division 4.5, chapter 11, section 66261.4 and chapter 23, article 1 (commencing with § 66273.6) and article 7 (commencing with § 66273.70). In addition, DTSC proposes to add regulations in California Code of Regulations, title 22, division 4.5, chapter 23, article 8 (commencing with § 66273.81), article 9 (commencing with § 66273.90), and article 10 (commencing with § 66273.100).

Government Code section 11346.1(a)(2) requires that every person who has filed a request for notice of DTSC's proposed regulations receive this notification of proposed emergency regulatory action (re-adoption of emergency regulations) at least five (5) working days before the proposed emergency action is filed with the Office of Administrative Law (OAL). Upon filing and posting on OAL's Internet Web site, interested persons will have five (5) calendar days to submit comments on the proposed emergency regulations pursuant to Government Code section 11349.6. OAL will have ten (10) calendar days from the date of DTSC's filing to review and make a decision on the proposed emergency rule. If approved, the emergency regulations will remain in effect until September 15, 2018, a period of 2 years past the original readoption expiration date, September 15, 2016.
