EMERGENCY PERMIT

On February 1, 2019, a transporter, World Oil Environmental Services, arrived at the DK Dixon facility to off-load used oil. On February 4, 2019, DK Dixon requested an Emergency Permit from the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) for transfer of hazardous waste from a tanker truck into another container at 7300 Chevron Way, Dixon, California 95620.

Upon arrival to the DK Dixon facility, the used oil was tested and found to have a flash point of less than 100°F. This classifies the waste as hazardous waste under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). DK Dixon does not have a permit to manage RCRA hazardous waste and the tanker truck does not meet the specifications that would allow it to transport ignitable hazardous waste.

DTSC has determined that the waste poses an imminent and substantial endangerment to human health and the environment, if not properly managed. Therefore, an emergency permit has been issued. This Emergency Permit is effective from February 5, 2019 through March 4, 2019. The Emergency Permit includes measures to minimize any adverse impact to the community and the environment. The permit allowed for approximately 3,100 gallons of used oil to be transferred. The hazardous waste was transferred to an appropriate container on February 5, 2019 and then transported offsite to an authorized facility. DK Dixon was required to submit a follow-up report to DTSC verifying that all hazardous waste was safely transferred.

CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA): DTSC has determined that the project is exempt from the requirements of CEQA and has filed a Notice of Exemption (NOE) with the State Clearinghouse.
