| <u>Chapter 45</u> pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25200.14 regarding phase I environmental assessment | <u>§67450.25(a)(5)</u> Maintain compliance with Health and Safety Code section 25200.14 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Except Phase I environmental assessment must be completed and filed with the Department, at the same address specified in section 66270.60(d)(6)(A), within one year of commencing operation pursuant to section 66270.60. • The Phase I environmental assessment shall be limited to the area defined by the operational boundary of the PHHWCF. The assessment shall be conducted only on the area directly affected by the operations of the PHHWCF. Corrective action, if any, taken pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25200.14(f), shall be limited to releases from regulated units at the PHHWCF. • The certification required by Health and Safety Code section 25200.14(c) may be obtained from the owner, operator, or their designee, a professional engineer registered in the State of California, a registered geologist, or a registered environmental assessor. |
