Technical Assistance Grant Program



Cleanup in Vulnerable Communities Initiative (CVCI)

- Senate Bill 158
- Cleanup in Vulnerable Communities Initiative (CVCI)
- Allocated \$500 million to expedite the cleanup and beneficial reuse of idled properties that may be contaminated
- Prioritized properties in historically vulnerable and disadvantaged communities
- Includes TAG program



Technical Assistance Grant (TAG) Program

- Program funds a technical advisor for communities
 - Advisor helps the community understand and engage with **response actions** at DTSC Cleanup sites
- Program also funds community science
 - Community science provides a more hands-on opportunity for engagement

Eligibility Part 1- Project Area Requirements

- Be in a vulnerable community, generally defined as sites with a CalEnviroScreen 3.0 score of >75%
- Currently, should be a DTSC Site Mitigation & Restoration Program site (“Cleanup” sites)
- Community must be near a site undergoing a **response action**

Eligibility Part 1- Project Area Requirements

- For DTSC sites, **response actions** include investigation through operation and maintenance
 - Investigations (e.g., sampling, characterization, Preliminary Endangerment Assessment)
 - Remedy selection (e.g., Removal Action Work Plan)
 - Cleanup (e.g., implementing the remedy through soil excavation)
 - Operation and maintenance (e.g., making sure remedy remains protective over time)
- Sites in any of these stages are eligible

Eligibility Part 2 - Applicant requirements

- 2 types of applicants: Community Group & Technical Advisor
- Requirements:
 - Independent of the response actions (i.e., not affiliated with the Responsible Party)
 - Community support and backing
 - Technical Advisor will need relevant education and experience

Application Process

- Interested parties will submit an application
 - Applicant will be community group or technical advisor
 - Application will be for general program or community science program
- Will need to meet site and eligibility requirements
 - Includes proof of community support
- DTSC will share evaluation criteria in advance of application process
- DTSC will review applications and award funds accordingly
- Other application details to be determined



Fund management

- Applicants will be responsible for managing grant funds
 - Includes organization, accounting, tracking etc.

General Timeline for Technical Assistance Grant (TAG)

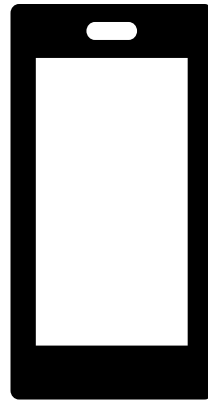
- Goal of this session is to gain information to help with development of the TAG program

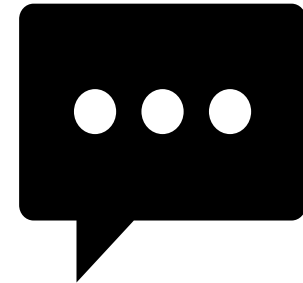

Technical Advisors

- To be chosen and/or approved by the community
- Assists the community in understanding and becoming more involved with response actions
- General advisors and community science advisors
 - Community science will be discussed later in this presentation

Examples of Technical Advisor Duties

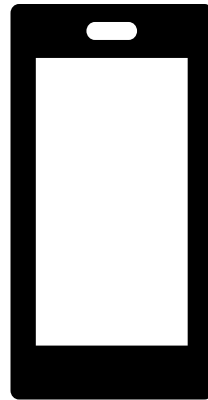
- Assist with understanding of DTSC Cleanup process
- Create fact sheets
- Observe fieldwork
- Attend public meetings
- Interpret and convey site documents
- Assist with comment preparation
- Teach scientific principles

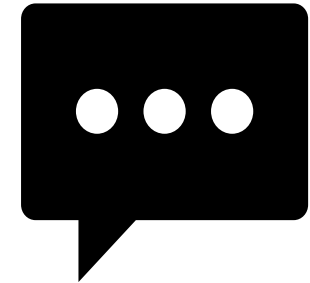

Community Science

- What is Community Science?
- Opportunity for communities to engage in the field, in the classroom, or from home
 - Facilitated by community science technical advisor
 - Guided by challenges in each community

Examples of Community Science Advisor Duties

- Train community members
- Health & Safety Monitoring (e.g., air monitoring)
- Data collection
- Site visit
- Laboratory visit

Community Science Example

- DTSC Environmental Chemistry Laboratory in Pasadena hosted high school students
- Students learned about toxics in everyday products. One question formulated was whether products marketed to different genders have different levels of 1,4-dioxane.



Community Science Example continued

- Students learned how to:
 - Use and calibrate laboratory instruments
 - Prepare and analyze samples
 - Report and present analytical results
- A similar program could be offered through TAG Community Science, as related to response actions

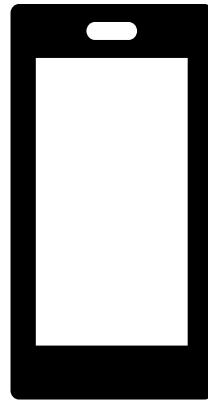
