INSTALLATION OF SOIL VAPOR EXTRACTION SYSTEM

811 11th Avenue, Delano, CA 93215

The Delano PCE Plume in Downtown Delano was discovered in 2010 when PCE was observed during monitoring for a nearby cleanup site. Three current or former dry cleaners near Main Street and 10th Avenue are likely sources for the Plume. They are Oasis Cleaners located at 920 Main Street, Oak Lane Cleaners (formerly Delano Cleaners) located at 910 Main Street, and Delano Former National Cleaners located at 811 11th Avenue. The California Environmental Protection Agency Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) is overseeing the construction and installation of two Soil Vapor Extraction (SVE) systems that have been designed to remediate the source areas of PCE. Construction of one of the SVE systems is complete. That system will now be transported to the location at 811 11th Avenue to be installed and connected to the extraction wells and electrical connection that are already in place. Tanks that hold Granular Activated Carbon, which treats the extracted vapors, will also be brought in and installed at the location.

Why is remediation being done?

SVE remediation is being done to remove contamination from the Site.

Who is doing the work?

Engineering/Remediation Resources Group, Inc.

When will it begin and how long will it last?

Installation will begin on April 16th and last until approximately June 1st.

Will traffic be impacted?

No. Neighborhood streets will be open for through-traffic. Access to businesses and properties will not be blocked, however some the alleyway behind 811 11th Avenue may be temporarily blocked.

What safety measures are being taken to protect workers and the neighboring community?

Engineering/Remediation Resources Group, Inc. will use its standard health and safety (H&S) procedures, a project specific H&S plan, and COVID-19 safety procedures while conducting the work.

What will happen next?

The SVE system will be inspected by local authorities and community members will be notified prior to start-up and a second SVE system will be installed in the coming months. The SVE system will be inspected and maintained regularly and will run until the DTSC-approved remedial action objectives have been satisfied.
